Biographical / Administrative History

Jonathan T. Horne, b.1894, Cork, organist, music teacher. Teacher of singing, piano, organ and theory at the Cork School of Music. Conductor of the School of Music choir which won many awards at the Cork Choral Festival. Organist and choirmaster at various parish churches and St. Finbarre's Cathedral 1922 – 1977; founder of the Cathedral's Oratorio Society. Theatre enthusiast. Founder member of Gilbert and Sullivan Theatre in the Cork Opera House.

A: Scrapbooks and Programmes

1. c1895 - c1910

Scrapbook compiled by Frank Thompson, containing theatre related newsclippings and hand bills, for unknown theatres in Cork (possibly, Cork Opera House) and also Theatre Royal and Gaeity Theatre, Dublin. Includes Shakespearian plays, etc. Also set of newsclippings relating to various plays and actors in London, signed 'To my true and loyal friend Jack Horne, a small token in remembrance of happy times... Frank Thompson Nov. 24th 1912'.

Scrapbook containing theatre related newsclippings and hand bills including a 1909 Romeo and Juliet production at Cork Opera House by F.R. Benson and his Shakespearian Company. Also includes a set of cigarette collectors photos of various actors.

Scrapbook containing theatre related newsclippings and programmes, including; 'The Manxman' at Opera House, Cork 13 Jan 1908; various plays in Dublin and London; Cork Opera House Company Limited, plan of seats in theatre, 1909; photos of various productions and actors including Edward Terry and Martin Harvey.

Scrapbook containing theatre related newsclippings and programmes, including address by FR Benson to the Cork Catholic Young Men's Society (18 Jan 1909); letters in Cork Constitution re. 'The Playboy of the Western World', Aug 1910; play in aid of the House of Industry, 'The Miser, at the New Theatre Royal,

Princes Street (marked 'Cork ...1791'; Abbey Theatre, Lady Gregory's latest play (Jan 1911) ; also newsclip photos of various plays and actors, also some enclosures, including a programme for a grand concert at Christ Church School Room, 10 Apr 1896

Scrapbook containing newsclippings relating to various lectures and plays held in Cork, such as the pantomime Sleeping Beauty at the Opera House, 17 Jan 1910; and such as Cork Municipal School of Music, Choral Society Lecture by Professor Thero Gmur at City Hall (7 Feb 1910); Cork Dramatic Society, The Dun Theatre, 'The Burden' by EK Worthington and 'Struck' by Con O'Leary, May [1910]; programme, Assembly Rooms Picturedrome, showing Rory O'More and other films/pictures (November 1911)

Scrapbook containing theatre related newsclippings and programmes; such as opera 'La Traviata' at the Assembly Rooms, 1904; Italian Grand Opera at the Opera House (August 1909)

Scrapbook entitled 'Criticisms of Performances at Opera House Cork, from the beginning of the Autumn Season August 4, 1913', signed 'JT Horne 7 August 1913'

Scrapbook containing theatre related newsclippings and programmes, mainly relating to Cork Opera House; including 'A Message from Mars' by Richard Ganthony, Mr. F. Mouillot's Company, with electrical effects by JN Maskelyne, August 1910; Alexander Marsh and Carrie Baillie Shakespearian and Classical

Repertoire, May 1912; also photos of the old Opera House which was destroyed in 1955.
